

TEACHER TASK FORCE COMPENSATION RECOMMENDATIONS

- Extend state minimum salary schedule experience years from 23 to 30
- Begin modernizing teacher pay towards career ladder (\$10M)
- Critical needs subject areas (\$25M)
- Teacher classroom supplies increase from \$350 to \$400 (\$2.7M); goal of \$500 by 2026



BRIDGE AGE HEAT MAP


60-70 years: 1,542 (Yellow Dots)
