## But How? – <u>KNOW</u>LEDGE AKA, Know Your Stuff – AND Theirs

- Know the Rules
  - "He/She who Knows the Rules, Rules"
- Know the Players
  - Agencies and Institutions
  - Officials (Elected and Appointed)
  - Staffs (Where the real work gets done)
- Know the Process
  - "School House Rocks"
  - How to make a law
  - The Committee Process
    - The Legislative Process
    - The Budget Process\*

\*In reality, one legislative year can accommodate and process <u>only several larger consequential bills</u> each year. The budget is one of those bills and must pass for governmental operations to continue.

#### USC Columbia Access and Affordability – The Big Picture

Increasing Access and Affordability for <u>More</u> South Carolinians from <u>All</u> Backgrounds

#### Affordability

- Columbia's Tuition and Fees have been unchanged for a <u>record</u> 5 consecutive years.
- At \$12,688, USC's sticker price for in-state students is almost \$2,500 less per year than Clemson and is less TODAY than Clemson charged 10 years ago.
- When factoring for state and other aid, USC's actual outof-pocket cost for SC residents is \$6,229 – more than 50% <u>less</u> than the sticker price.
- With renewed state investment, USC Columbia has more than <u>doubled</u> in-state students receiving state needbased aid over the last 3 years, to more than 4,300 students today. <u>Note: More than 50% of these students</u> <u>are underrepresented minorities.</u>
- We've also <u>increased</u> the size of the award by more than 65%, up from \$2,000 to \$3,300 per student today!

#### Access

- Fall 2023: Columbia welcomed its <u>largest</u> freshman class ever, enrolling <u>more SC residents</u> than any time in the university's 222year history.
- Specifically, almost 4,000 freshmen hail from SC in Fall '23's freshman class that's a 17% increase over Fall '22!
- More than 20% of Columbia's students are the first in their families to go to college (aka "first generation" students).

#### And not only is USC serving more South Carolinians than ever, but it is also reflecting more of South Carolina than ever. Consider that:

- Underrepresented minorities increased by 12% over last year and represent almost one-quarter (25%) of USC Columbia's freshmen class.
- Columbia enrolls more African American students than <u>any</u> college in South Carolina.
- Columbia enrolls more African American students as a percentage of undergraduate enrollment than the following peer institutions: UNC-Chapel Hill, UGA, Rutgers University-New Brunswick, Georgia Tech, UVA, NC State, Virginia Tech, as well as Clemson.

And Coming for Fall '24 – GUARANTEED ADMISSION for ALL SC High School Grads in the Top 10% (at Columbia) and Top 20% at USC Aiken, Beaufort and Upstate!

### USC - the State's <u>Most Comprehensive</u> Health Care Research and Education System

• The USC system awards more than 5,000 health care-related degrees annually, including 800 nursing degrees.



- USC Columbia, in partnership with the State, is constructing a new health sciences campus (HSC) to house the School of Medicine Columbia. The HSC will provide state-of-the-art space for clinical education and bring together eminent researchers to help meet S.C.'s health challenges, *including the creation of USC's new Brain Health* <u>Network</u>.
- Overall, the health sciences campus represents a \$300M investment in the future of the state's health and economic well-being, and continued legislative support of this important project is critical to its success.
