## 1) State and local government expenditures / estimates for COVID 19 response:

In accordance with section 502 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, 42 U.S.C. 5121-5207 (the “Stafford Act”), eligible emergency protective measures taken to respond to the COVID-19 emergency may be reimbursed under Category B of FEMA’s Public Assistance program. A 25% cost-share is required. SCEMD has received CARES Act funding for the cost share requirement for eligible state and local government applicants.

**4) EMPG-Supplemental**

The Emergency Management Performance Grant-Supplemental program is authorized by Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, Div. B (Pub. L. No. 116-136) and the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, Pub. L. No. 93-288 (codified as amended at 42 U.S.C. § 5121 et seq.). Title VI of the Stafford Act authorizes FEMA to make grants for the purpose of providing a system of emergency preparedness for the protection of life and property in the United States from hazards and to vest responsibility for emergency preparedness jointly in the federal government and the states and their political subdivisions. This grant requires a dollar for dollar non-federal matching requirement and expires on January 26, 2022. In October, the US Treasury indicated that CARES Act/CRF funding could be used as match for the FY2020 EMPG and EMPG Supplemental. SCEMD will revise our grant applications to account for our spending in Project #3- PPE Warehouse and Management (listed above). Counties will no longer have to match their grants with local funding.
