Purpose: Pursuant to the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2020, U.S. Treasury allocated Emergency Rental Assistance program funding to assist households that are unable to pay rent or utilities, or experienced other financial hardship due, directly or indirectly, to the COVID-19 outbreak. The U.S. Treasury allocated funds to the highest-need areas, where job loss and high market costs have made it especially difficult for low-income renters. This tally consolidates SC Stay Plus and SC Stay Plus 2 previously reported.
